AGM 2015

A very business-like OWS AGM was held at the Barley Mow on Richmond Road on 20 May. The number of people attending was down from the figures for recent years, which may have been because the event was held on a Wednesday (choir night for some), because of the lack of parking on Richmond Road (however, side streets, including Roosevelt Ave. up to familiar Westminster Presbyterian, offer spaces) or because the meeting was held in the basement of the Barley Mow, which required people to negotiate stairs (the stairs in question are sturdy. the staircase fairly wide and people seemed reasonably comfortable with the separate room, which was not disturbed by noise from the pub upstairs). A further stroke of chance meant that our very capable waitress will be studying at Cardiff University for a year starting in September. I'm not sure that many other venues in Ottawa could have offered that. If these or other factors prevented you from attending, please let us know so that we can try to schedule future AGMs at times and in places that will make it easier for people to come and exercise their democratic control over the Society's doings.

A number of new members had joined the Society during the year and contact will soon be made with those members who have not yet sent in their membership dues for the current year. It was felt that the Society should continue to encourage students and other young people to attend our events and to participate in the Society and, to this end, membership of the Society will be extended free of charge, for one year, to students attending Carleton University and the University of Ottawa. The Society had been represented at the Celtic Festival in Montreal in early

May and would strive to "wave the flag" at similar events in the future.

Financially, the year's activities had resulted in a modest shortfall. Explanations were offered and suggestions were made as to how that could be avoided in future. All members of last year's committee agreed to continue to help guide the Society's fortunes for another year and they have now been joined by John Williams, who will be a valuable addition to the team.

The Executive has not yet decided precisely what events will be held in the coming year but a suggestion was made that the OWS acknowledge and pay tribute to what will be the 150th Anniversary of the Founding of the Welsh colony in Patagonia, Argentina. Our fellow member Professor Pawl Birt is a leading authority on the history of the colony and it is possible that the OWS celebration would take a form similar to that in which we celebrated the centenary of Dylan Thomas's birth early in 2015. Stay tuned. If you are not familiar with the story of Y Wladfa (the colony), a very pleasant place to start the journey of discovery might be an article published in the Daily Telegraph on 25 May and available at http://www.dailytelegraph.co.uk/travel/ destinations/southamerica/argentina/11628506/Welsh-Patagonia-MandS-cherries-and-red-dragons.html (Note: This is not a hot link, due to the length of the URL.)

Although the Festival is not really an OWS event, much of the Society's focus in the coming year will be on the Gŵyl Gymreig Ontario/Ontario Welsh Festival to be held in Ottawa from April 22 to 24, 2016. The Three Welsh Tenors and Côrdydd, a choir from Cardiff, will be featured. Further information may be obtained at www.ontariowelshfestival.ca. Happy 90th Birthday, Shirley Griffiths



Originally born a Canadian (she was born in Windsor ... Ontario) on June 26th, 1925 to a Welsh father and English mother, Shirley was raised in Llanberis in North Wales by her paternal grandmother after her mother passed away suddenly when she was 5 years old [she was in the UK visiting with her mother when this happened. She found herself an English speaker in a Welsh language only village and quickly adapted. She went to the local Welsh-language schools Dolbadrn Council primary and Brynrefail County before going to St Mary's College, a teacher's training school in Bangor, during the war.

Shirley remembers bombs whistling past while she was visiting her Welsh aunty in Manchester.

She met her husband, Tal, on a train in Cardiff in the early 50s. She was early, he was late. He was on a visit home from Morocco where he worked. They married in Morocco in December 1953. Shirley and daughter Julie joined Tal, who had been working in the Canadian Arctic, in Montreal in 1957. They became active in the St David's Society of Montreal. They moved to Ottawa in 1967 where dad took up a post as a highs school teacher. Now there were two daughters including Sian born in Montreal.

They became active in the Ottawa Welsh Society. He was also very active in the choir. Tal was president 3 times including co-chair of the North American Gymanfa held in Ottawa in 1977. Shirley stood in as Membership Secretary.

She recalls that they gave a lift home to John Diefenbaker and his wife, Olive (think this would be post time as PM ...) a lift in their trusty but second hand Ford Meteor after a St David's Day banquet at the Chateau Laurier - he was guest of honour. Doubt that would happen in these post 911, ISIS-wary days! Both were active teaching in the Welsh school which ran during the late 70s (??) when it was taught on Saturdays.

Shirley fondly remembers the family hosting rugby players, choirs, visiting teachers and academics from Wales. She also remembers (mostly) hosting Welsh Society parties and singing in the Welsh-themed basement pub which she and dad built together. She was on the Ottawa University Celtic Chair founding committee...

They moved back to Carmarthen, Wales for fresh adventures in 1995 like ... visiting Hitler's hideaway in Bergtesgarten or the Chateau in the Loire Valley where the Marquis de Sade was reputed to have spent his summer holidays as a youth, or nearly being driven off the cliffs in Monaco or sleeping in the car overnight in Switzerland!!

Shirley loyally nursed Tal until he passed away in January 2011. She remains very involved in the Carmarthen Twinning Association. Carmarthen is twinned with Lesneven in Brittany in France - she's made several happy trips there. She is also involved with the Civic Society, the Carmarthen Museum, U3A, and enjoyed a stint as a local tour guide. She often thinks of her friends in the Welsh community in Ottawa. Certainly, her friends in Carmarthen hear all the tales!
