The dosbarth Cymraeg is moving along in the "Dysgu Cymraeg" program. The recent sessions have focused on the past tense to describe an activity that happened over a period of time or that used to happen.

Enghreifftiau/Examples

Roedd y tywydd yn braf ddoe. *The weather was fine yesterday.*

Roedd hi'n athrawes. She used to be a teacher.

The full conjugation of the verb to be (BOD) would be:

Affirmative:

Ro'n i I was/used to be
Ro't ti You were /used to be
Roedd hi/e/o She/he was/used to be
Ro'n ni We were/used to be
Ro'ch chi You were/used to be
Ro'n nhw They were/used to be

Negative:

As in the present tense, change the "r" to a "d".

Do'n i ddim
Do't ti ddim
Doedd hi/o ddim
Do'n ni ddim
Do'ch chi ddim
Do'n nhw ddim
Do'n nhw ddim

I wasn't/didn't used to
You weren't/didn't used to
You weren't/didn't used to
They weren't/didn't used to

Interrogative:

O'n i? Was 1?/Did I used to?
O't ti? Were you?/Did you used to?
Oedd hi/o? Was she/he?/Did she/he used to?
Oedden ni? Were we?/Did we used to?
Oeddech chi? Were you?/Did you used to?
Oedden nhw? Were they?/Did they used to?

Enghreifftiau:

I used to live next door. Ro'n i'n byw drws nesa.

He was walking to work. Roedd o'n cerdded i'r gwaith.

The guests were treated to the lovely tones of Mary Muckle's Celtic lever harp playing Welsh and other Celtic tunes.

The Noson lawen began (almost) on time under the skilled leadership of Myfanwy Davies, a visual treat in a black chiffon top sporting a huge red dragon. The talents of the various members of the Ontario Gymanfa Ganu Association were showcased, interspersed with various funny stories from the MC. Our own Anastasia Llewellyn played the ukulele and sang. The program ended with a spirited presentation of songs by our guest artists, Trystan Llŷr Griffiths (tenor) and Steffan Lloyd Owen (baritone). Both were accompanied by the wonderful Rhiannon Pritchard who also played for several of the earlier performers.

The Gold Award Banquet was a tasty and enjoyable occasion. The Gold Award went to Sheryl Clay Newell, who directed a Gymanfa for us here in Ottawa in 2019. She has also done much to keep Welsh alive in Ontario and to keep Welsh music flowing. She was very helpful in the move of Dewi Sant Church to Timothy Eaton Memorial Church. A photo was taken of the Gold Award Winners who were in attendance.



As always, the concert was a highlight of the weekend. The three musicians provided a varied and most enjoyable program of solos (vocal and piano) and duets in Welsh and other European languages. The performance ended with a rousing rendition of *Hen wlad fy Nhadau* and the traditional standing ovation followed the performance.



Both evenings ended with an "Afterglow" for the strong of heart and constitution. Hymns were sung and the soloists were prevailed upon to provide additional treats.

On Sunday, after a leisurely morning, people found their way to the Avondale United Church, which is approximately 2.5 kilometres from the hotel. The Gymanfa itself was conducted by Betty Cullingworth and Sheryl Clay Newell, in turns. Both of these ladies are Gold Award winners and have conducted gymanfoedd for us here in Ottawa. The organist, Matthew Coons was new to us, but is known to the Toronto crowd from Dewi Sant United Church and as principal accompanist for Toronto Welsh Male Voice Choir. It was a rousing session, beginning with Blaenwern and ending with Cwm Rhondda (followed by "Hen Wlad fy Nhadau" and the usual "God Be With Us".) There were smiles and hugs as the group disbanded and people began their journey home. We offer many thanks to those hardworking organizers who planned and executed a wonderful weekend of Welsh culture.

Membership

Membership levels held up well for the year 2023-24. We had 65 paid-up members compared with 66 for the previous year. Total membership was 95, indicating that some 30 memberships were not paid.

To address this, we contacted members that we had not heard from for a few years and as a result have removed those that could not be contacted by either phone or email. Everyone with a current email address has been left on the list as well as those that we know have no email address.

Going forward (2024-25) we have a total membership of 90, a mix of single (29) and family (36) members. Only forty-four (44) of our membership fees have been received so far, well below where we would expect to be at this time of the year. Our administration costs are modest, but we have very high insurance costs and are dependent on our fees for keeping the Ottawa Welsh Society alive and running.
